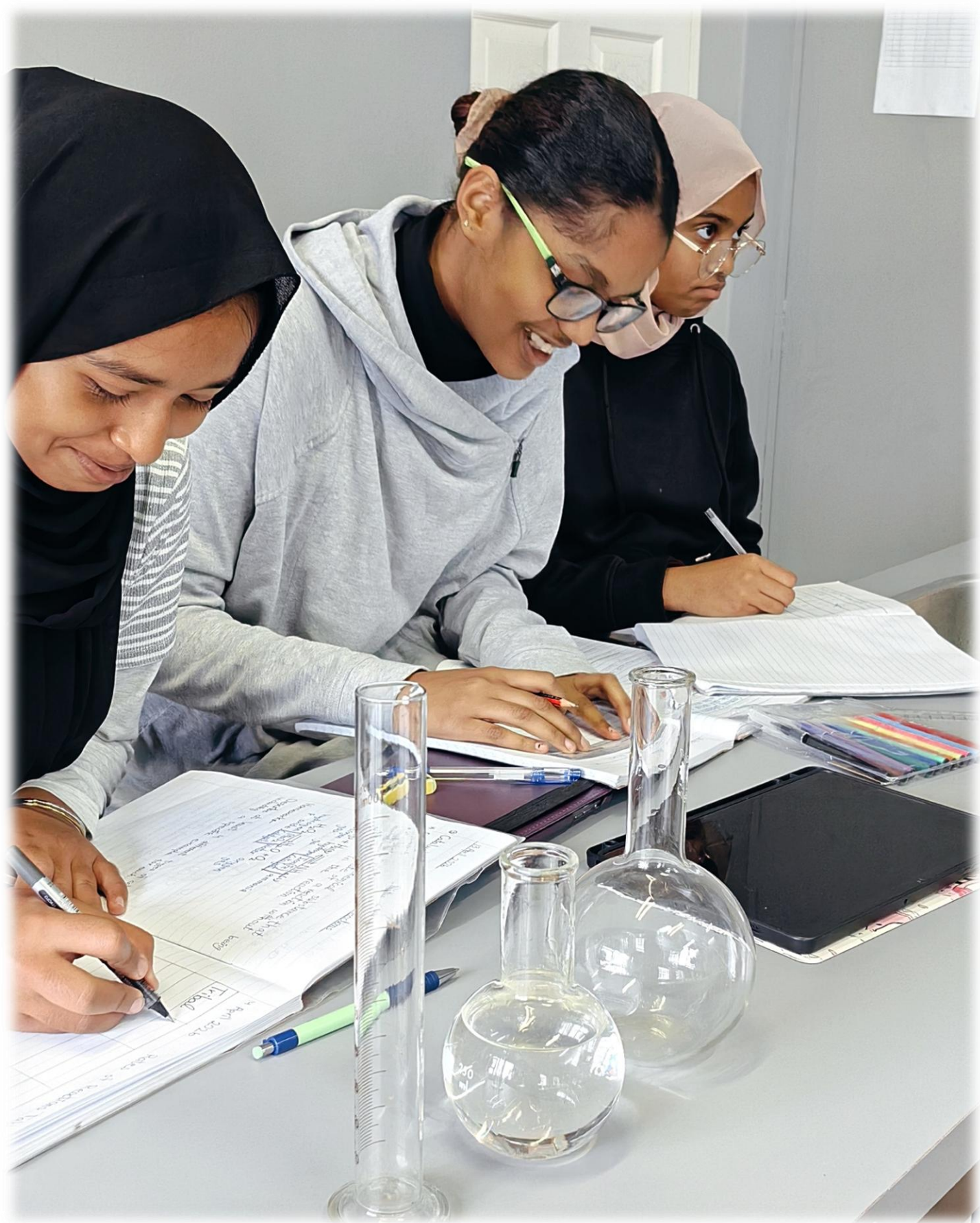
The Oxygen Cycle

Example: Cat 1	Persian - long white fur, flat face, blue eyes	All are domestic cats, have fur, whiskers, claws, four legs, tail	Long thick fur Flat face shape eye colour (Blue)	Continuous
Example: Cat 2	Bengal - brown/white fur, spotted or marbled pattern	All cats have tails, ears, eyes, whiskers and similar body structure	Spotted/striped fur pattern sleek, athletic build Green/brown eyes	Discontinuous
Example: Cat 3	Australian Mist - short dense blue/green fur, green eyes	Shares basic cat features like claws, fur, tail, ears	very short fur Solid & grey colour eye colour (yellow/green)	Discontinuous
Example: Cat 4	Tabby - brown fur, black stripes, almond eyes	All have similar body structure, are mammals, same number of legs	Striped fur pattern	Discontinuous





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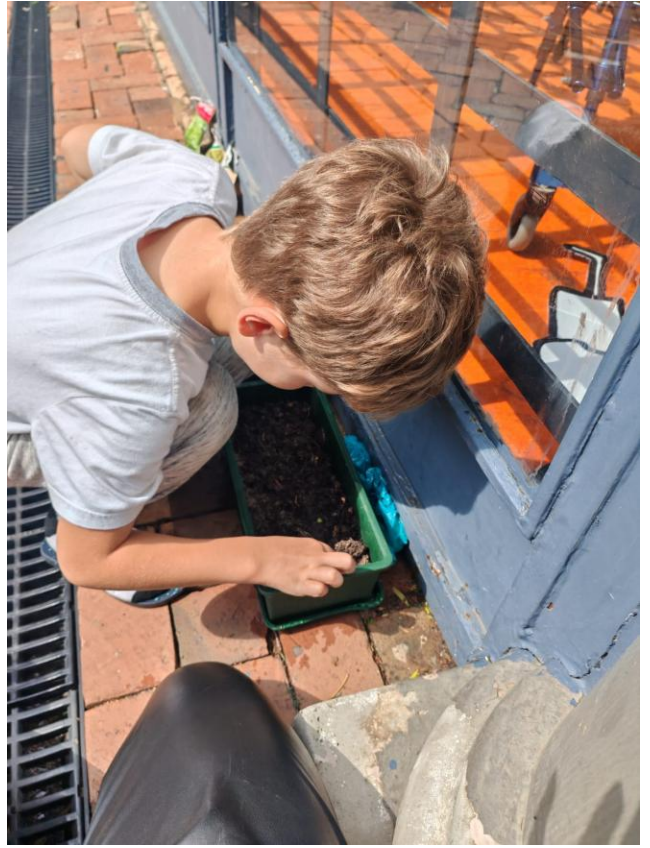
