Thank you for your dedication, your resilience, and your belief in our students and in one another. Let us continue building — and celebrating — together.

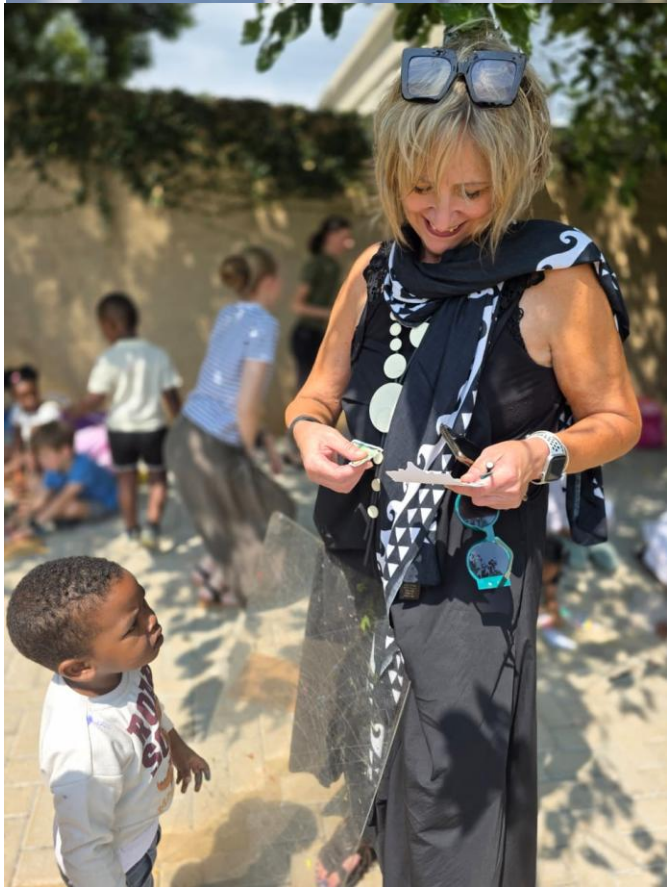

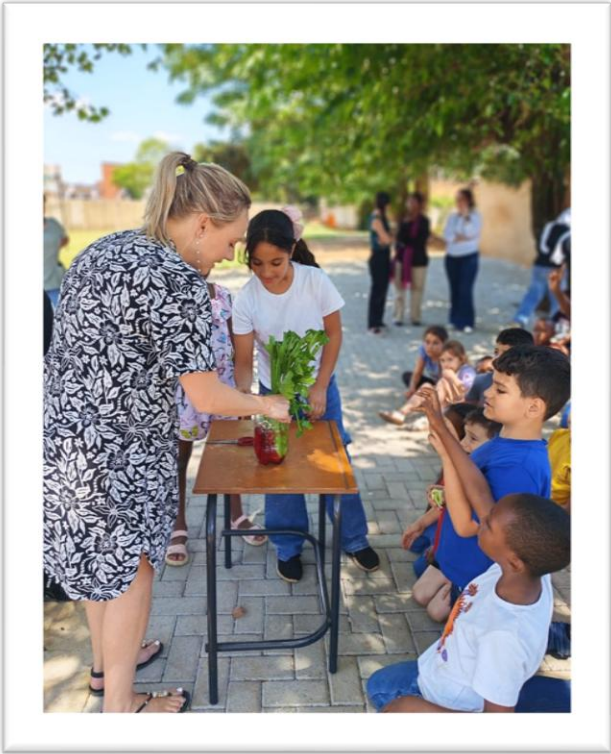

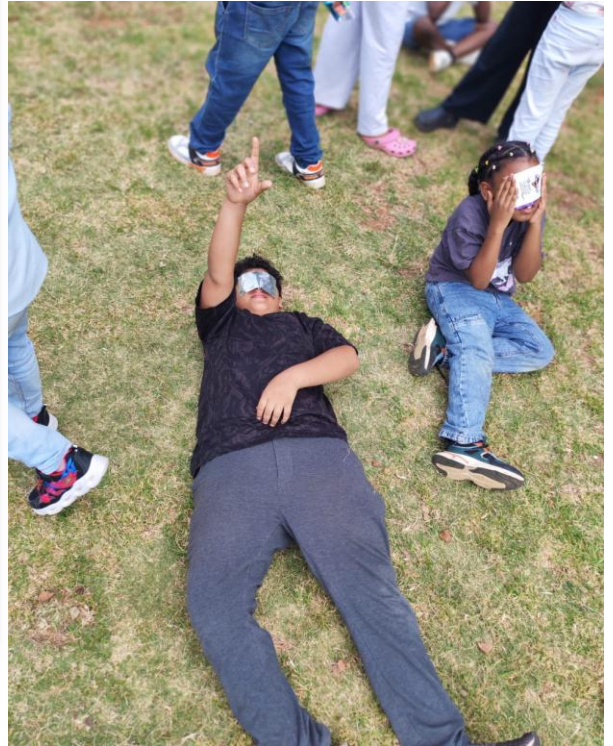
