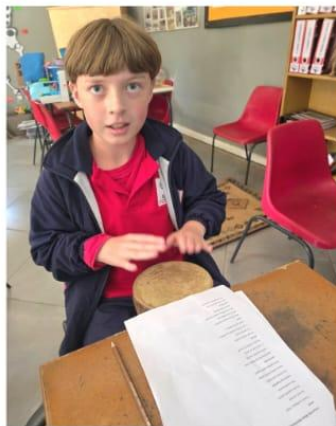
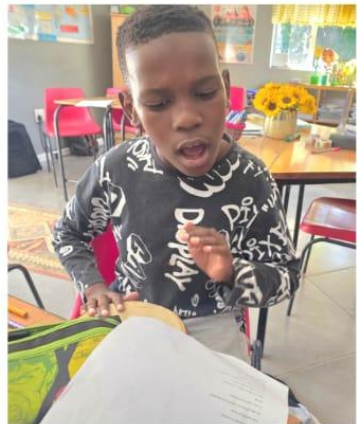
Charity swim in support of Singakwenza — “We can do it!”

In another lessons they explored extreme weather through interactive Science experiments focused on tornadoes and hurricanes.







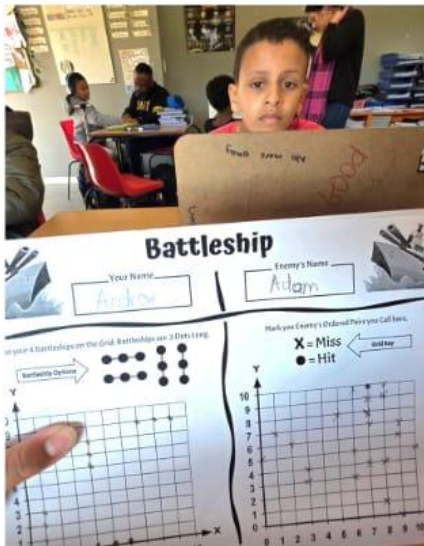
