The activity strengthened early confidence, clarity, and purposeful speaking.

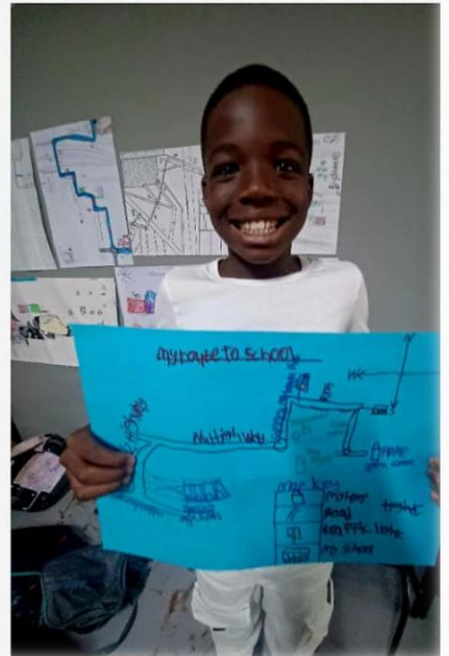
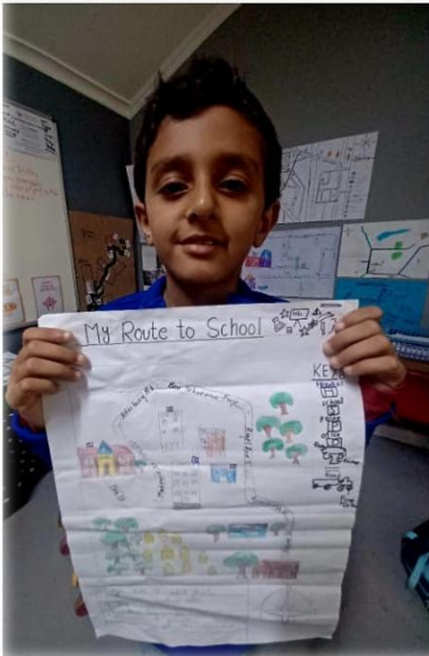
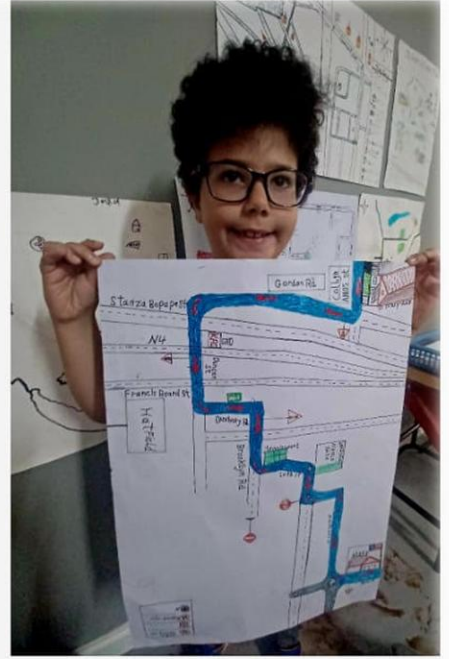
Grades KG, 2 & 3 – Science Spark: Gas-Release Discovery

Grade 3 applied early geography skills by mapping their route from home to school.

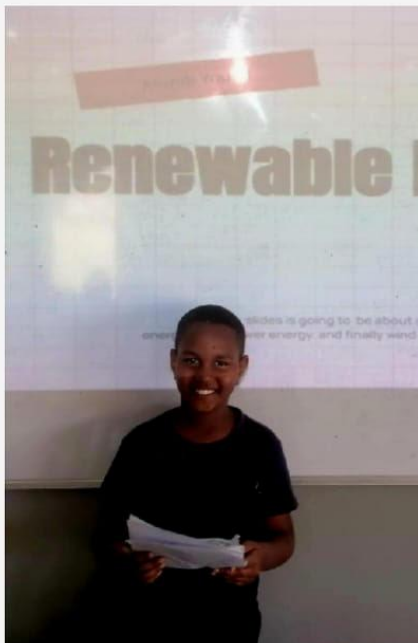
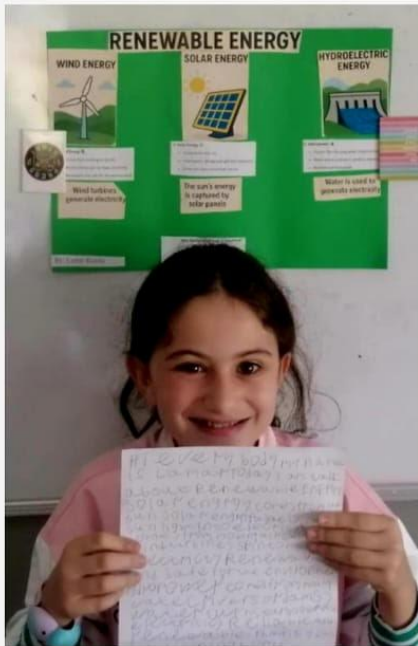
This activity developed:

They demonstrated strong research skills, creativity, and thoughtful presentation. Good job everyone!



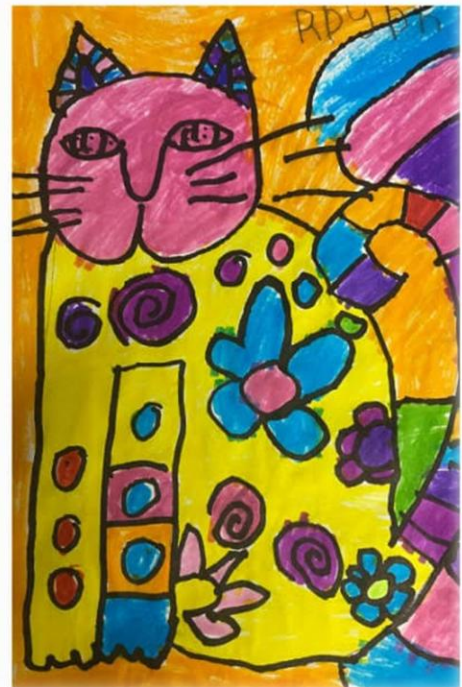
Grade 5 – Science & Geography
